- ☆ 15 years as a chemistry tutor and teacher, most recently as a TA at the University of Victoria, with degrees from Princeton University (Honours Chemistry) and Concordia University (Environmental Toxicology);
- ☆ 13 years as producer and host of music and current affairs programs on WPRB Princeton and CKUT Montreal, founding Canadian community radio's first nationally syndicated human rights and environment program (*Native Solidarity News*) and earning NCRA Standard Awards for Programming Excellence and Community Involvement;
- ☆ 7 years as a contact improvisation dance student, teacher, and performer, most recently at Lynda Raino Dance;
- ☆ 7 summers as a food system worker, with farms, community gardens, restaurants, agricultural conservationists, and other businesses and organizations;
- ☆ 4 years as a shiatsu massage therapist, graduated from Guijek (*L'institut québécois pour la santé intégrale*) and licensed by the FQM.
